

He presented the 2013 Melendy Lecture on March 25 & 26: "Progress Toward Goals: Building a Medication Use System Our Country Deserves," Isetts was selected by the College Board to present his lecture and visit with students.

Michelle Johnson-Jennings was appointed to a 2-year term on the National Institute of Health, National Institute of Drug Abuse (NIDA) American Indian Alaska Native work group. This group makes recommendations to NIDA on research needed to better understand, prevent and treat substance abuse and addiction in American Indian/Alaska Native populations and to develop addiction research capacity in those communities. **Johnson-Jennings** also received an Ro1 NIH/NIDA grant for her project, *American Indians, Substance Use, and HIV Risk Behaviors: Secondary Data Analysis of the National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health*.



Serguei Pakhomov is one of three co-PIs on an R01 award from the National Library of Medicine. The project, *Natural Language Processing for Clinical and Translational Research*, will receive \$148K per year for four years. **Pakhomov** also received a \$400,000 award from the Alzheimer's Association for his project, *Automated Semantic Indices for Early Detection of Cognitive Changes*.
